

Classes for College Credit

Sandy High School students can **jump start** college by earning Mt. Hood Community College credit for selected high school classes. Mt. Hood Community College credit can be earned for general education academic courses that may transfer to a four-year university and professional technical credits that apply toward a technical degree program at MHCC. Credits earned while at Sandy High School will save you time by not having to repeat the same course at MHCC. Through a special agreement between Sandy High School and MHCC, the cost for college has been reduced far below tuition rates for the same class on campus - saving money!!

General Education Academic Courses, also known as Early Collegiate Opportunity (ECO), earns MHCC credit that can be used to satisfy the general education requirement for many college degrees or majors. Sandy High School offers upper-level courses in English, Math, History, German, French and Spanish that earn MHCC credit. These credits may transfer to Oregon public four-year universities. Professional Technical Courses, also known as 2+2 or Tech Prep, earn MHCC credit that can be used to satisfy technical course requirements that are part of a professional technical degree or certificate program at MHCC. These credits are unique to MHCC and in most cases may not transfer to a four-year university. However, with the growth of technical careers that require a two-year degree, this option when joined with ECO, can save both time and money. The 2+2 or Tech Prep courses by Career Learning Framework follows:

Health and Human Resources

- Examining Health Careers Prerequisite

Industrial and Engineering Systems

- Advanced Horticulture
- Advanced Engineering Drafting
- Manufacturing Technology

- Advanced Mechanical Technology

High school credit for courses taken at Mt. Hood Community College is normally computed at 0.5 high school credits for each 3 credit hours awarded by the college for those courses numbered 100 or higher. For other course offerings, the student should ascertain the credit to be given prior to enrolling in the course. Courses in this guide that offer the potential for Mt.
