Student Supports

AntFarm on-going support for students and families. For more information, visit the AntFarm Café or call 503-668-9955.

- **Free in-person tutoring** Monday-Friday, scheduled individually. Depending of the tutor and youth availability, they offer 1:1 support from 8am-5pm throughout the week.
- **Axis Learning Center:** Tutoring and Driver's License Support. Tutors are volunteers with experience in teaching and have passed an application and criminal background check process.
- **LatinX Nuevo Futura:** A community driven program supporting access to services and while providing opportunities for LatinX youth and families.
- **Youth Workforce Development:** A variety of opportunities to include volunteering, internships, job skills training and employment.

COVID-19 Rent Assistance

Rent Assistance is for anyone who was working and has lost hours, was laid off, or has lost their business due to Covid-19. AntFarm has been awarded a contract for 2021 that can pay rent for folks under these conditions. They also offer a Paperwork PickUp Service at your doorstep.

COVID-19 Wrap Around Support

Wrap Around Support is for folks who have been diagnosed with Covid-19 and are in isolation or have been placed in quarantine due to exposure. AntFarm can pay rent, mortgage, utilities, and food during the one month of their isolation or quarantine. They also offer a Paperwork PickUp Service at your doorstep.

Health Care

School Based Health Center: OTSD students have access to comprehensive physical, mental, and preventive health services at the Sandy School-Based Health Center located at Sandy High School. The clinic is staffed by a family nurse practitioner, mental health therapist, and certified medical assistant.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, services are offered primarily through the use of telephone and video visits. Limited in-person visits will also be available on an as-needed basis, as will visits for immunizations, labs, blood pressure checks and other screenings. *Call (503) 668-3483 to make an appointment.*
