Sack Breakfast and Lunch for OTSD students

Furlough days

- OTSD furlough days are scheduled for: 5/27, 5/29, 6/2, and 6/4. There will be no meal pick-up or drop-off on these dates. However, meal service will be adjusted to ensure students receive meals for each day.
- Meal service adjustment for furlough days:
 - Tuesday 5/26: 2 days of meals for 5/26 and 5/27
 - Thursday 5/28: 4 days of meals for 5/27-5/31
 - Monday 6/1: 2 days of meals for: 6/1 and 6/2
 - Wednesday 6/3: 2 days of meals for 6/2 and 6/3

Use SNAP to Buy Groceries Online

Oregonians across the state who receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits can now purchase groceries online from Walmart and Amazon.

If your work hours are reduced or you lose your job, you may become eligible for SNAP if you meet eligibility requirements. You can apply for SNAP benefits without visiting an office. Apply online at **OHP.Oregon.Gov**.

Tax Filing

Oregonians now have until July 15 to file their personal income taxes with the state, Gov. Kate Brown said Wednesday, March 25. But any quarterly payments for 2020 still will be due on April 15. The IRS has extended its deadline to July 15 for filing personal and corporate federal tax returns, making payments, contributing to an IRA for 2019 and making the first quarterly estimated tax payment for 2020.

If your income has changed, you may be eligible for OHP

During this national emergency, it’s important you have access to health care. The Oregon Health Plan is free health coverage for those who qualify. If your income has changed recently, you may be eligible. You can get OHP even if you have been denied in the past.
