




Children Thrive Here!



Our mission is to provide students with access to rigorous, relevant, robust and reliable educational experiences.

The Oregon Trail School District spans 424 square miles and serves the communities of Sandy, Boring, and the Mt. Hood Area. We encompass several distinct, mostly unincorporated, rural areas of Clackamas County. Enrollment is approximately 4,500 students, K-12, with one high school, three middle schools, five elementary schools, and a K-12 Continuum IB charter school.

What makes Oregon Trail Schools outstanding?

Strong academic performance

- Oregon Trail students consistently outperform their peers statewide in meeting rigorous state standards in English Language Art, Mathematics, and Science, at all grade levels.
- SchoolDigger ranks Oregon Trail among the best districts in the county and state, with Oregon Trail ranking 15th out of 147 Oregon districts, and 3rd among Clackamas County school districts. Rankings are based on English Language Arts, mathematics, and science assessment scores supplied by the Oregon Department of Education.
- Oregon Trail ranks in the 95th percentile nationally. An academic study by researchers at Stanford University shows Oregon Trail students in grades 3-8 are achieving greater academic growth than those in all other Clackamas County school districts. The data analysis shows that over a 5 year span Oregon Trail students receive the equivalent of 5.8 years of education.
- Sandy High ACT and SAT scores are consistently above the state average. These tests assess educational development and the skills needed for success in first-year college coursework.



Comprehensive education opportunities

- Middle College partnership with MHCC providing opportunity for students to earn high school diploma and up to 72 college credits.



- Technology imbedded in classrooms across the district, grades 3-10.
 - K-12 Continuum International Baccalaureate charter school with Mandarin language instruction.
 - Arts education partnership with The Right Brain Initiative.
 - Little Steps school readiness program
 - Head Start and Oregon Promise preschool programs.
- Lab classes and interventions for students not on track for meeting their academic goals.
 - Freshman Seminar summer transition program to support students who may struggle adapting to the rigor of high school.
